In fact, it's the level of passion and enthusiasm that comes from loving the sport of karate so much that has made Docherty's club, the ICKF Karate School, so successful over the past decade.

Docherty, a Whitby resident and graduate of Father Leo J. Austin Catholic Secondary School, watched the club he started with seven students back in 2000 recently celebrate its 10th anniversary with now more than 100 on board for the ride.

Docherty is a decorated competitor in the sport. Also an assistant coach for the Ontario provincial karate team, Docherty has passed on his knowledge to his students, as the more than 1,000 medals won by the club would attest.

"I believe if you treat everyone like a champion, they'll all be champions," he says. "I try to envision the students at their best and help them achieve that goal."
